ACTING 4

(CORE Class)

**Fall, Winter, and Spring

MUSICAL THEATRE 4

(CORE Class)

Students add to their basic dance and vocal skills while exploring more advanced vocal & dance techniques that will serve them as a soloist and ensemble member. Both beginning and returning students will feel right at home in this class! This class culminates in an informal, in-class presentation of a musical theatre song and dance and fulfills a pre-requisite for the Performance Block.



FALL ELECTIVES

SLAPS AND SWORDS: LEARNING COMBAT CHOREOGRAPHY FOR THE STAGE \$135

Learn the basics of Stage Combat in this fun and informative course! Students work on both unarmed and armed combat over the course of six weeks, learning the proper language and techniques to approach combat storytelling in theatre. Students work on falls, grabs, slaps, and punches, and learn the basics of single sword fencing for the stage! By the end of class, students have a better understanding of how to safely and convincingly tell the story of combat on stage – and have a blast at the same time!

INTRODUCTION TO MONOLOGUES \$135

Monologues can be daunting for young actors, but with the right tools and guidance, they offer an opportunity to show off your talent and skills! This class is for students with some acting experience who are looking to deepen their skills, or are preparing for Summer Repertory Theatre Intensive, College/University Theatre Programs, or other pre-professional auditions.

WARN, STANDBY, GO: STAGE MANAGEMENT BASICS \$135

Stage Managers are the unsung heroes of every theatrical production! They tape floors, call cues, solve technical problems, and contain chaos. Join professional Stage Manager Amie Bajalieh in this fun, hands-on introduction to the most important job in the theatre.

WINTER ELECTIVES

MUSICAL THEATRE AUDITION \$135

Experienced instructors & performers take your students through the basics of auditioning for a musical theatre production so that they feel prepared and confident every time! Students work on a 16-32 bar audition song, practice the best ways to learn an audition dance combination, and learn audition tips & tricks. This class is for beginners and students who are looking to improve their musical theatre audition experience.

IMPROV 4 \$135

Building on the skills in Improv 3, through games, activities, and exercises, students learn how the art of improvisation can help improve their performance and unleash their creativity. Improv teaches students how to think on their feet, react to their scene partner(s) and make bigger choices in their acting.
